# Notes from the Headmaster

May is a busy month at Berrybrook, but not too busy to take some time to look back at what has happened since September. Because Berrybrook teachers are so skilled at documenting what happens during the year in photographs, they provide families with a very enjoyable way to look back. There were four memory book meetings this past week at Berrybrook. It was nice to see so many parents gather to go through all of the photographs teachers took this year, and plan a special keepsake for their children. These memory book meetings are an opportunity for a parent to reflect on the past year and see just how much their child has grown, and it is an opportunity for parents to gather together to celebrate their own success at the most challenging job in the world. A Berrybrook Memory Book is a very special item. There will be 99 of them made this year.

This past year, Berrybrook teachers were busy on another book project. As part of our accreditation process for the National Association for the Education of Young Children, teachers created a "Classroom Portfolio" for each group to demonstrate how their program meets over 400 criteria set by the NAEYC. During the month of May teachers and students will begin reflecting on the year at Berrybrook in their classrooms. They will remember favorite songs they sang throughout the year. Children may be asking teachers to repeat some of the activities and games they enjoyed during the fall and winter. Children will be saying to teachers, "Remember when you came to my house?" recalling the day when their teacher came to their house way back in September.

## 2 & 3 day Classroom Activities

The month of April was often rainy outside, but inside Berrybrook the children were sunny and energetic, anticipating the true onset of spring weather. The housekeeping areas in our classrooms were transformed into supermarkets and restaurants. Interesting food and colorful containers filled the supermarket shelves and the restaurant's kitchen. Customers were cheerfully served in both establishments and the children worked cooperatively.

Easter was celebrated with the traditional painting of blown eggs. Thanks to all who contributed to our collection and performed the delicate process of blowing out the egg middles. Another Easter tradition was making "wacky" cake. The children helped prepare the cake and then were delighted to see it transformed into a bunny with the addition of cool whip, jelly beans, pink construction paper and pipe cleaners!

After April vacation the children started exploring insects such as caterpillars, butterflies and ladybugs. We will touch upon their life cycles and the transformations these insects make in the spring. We will explore the vast ocean and the creatures that inhabit it. Children will be making beach collages and will enjoy a school wide beach day. The **Annual Trip to Duxbury Beach** has been happening at Berrybrook for many years and the children enjoy going to the beach with their entire class. The trip <u>for all classes</u> will be on Wednesday, May 12, with a rain date of Thursday, May 13. Teachers will not emphasize "the end" of the year, rather, we will allow for a natural Berrybrook ending with an ice-cream scoop countdown of the last few days. ## 4 & 5 Day Classroom Activities

On Tuesday, May 18, the Duxbury Community Partnerships for Children has arranged for the 4 & 5 Day Classes to take a **Kindergarten Bus Trip** to the Chandler Elementary

School in Duxbury. The 5 Day morning class will start their trip at 9:30. The 4 Day Class will start their trip at 12:30, so parents must arrive at Berrybrook at 12;15 on that day. While at Chandler, the children will walk through a kindergarten classroom, peek at the bathrooms, and see the library, nurse's office, cafeteria and playground. The goal of this visit is to help children anticipate Kindergarten positively by providing children a glimpse of what their school will be like next fall. Teachers will be providing permission slips for parents to sign.

The ice cream party on the last day of school is a special event. On Thursday, May 27, the 4 Day Class will arrive at 1:00 pm and their families will return to join us for ice cream at 2:30 pm. On Friday, May 28 the 5 Day Class will invite families to return at 10:30 for their ice cream day. It is our last day together as a class, but the children are always welcome. The teachers always enjoy a visit from past Berrybrookers and their families.

#### The more things change . . .

One of greatest motivations for me to serve as a Board member is that is allows me to remain immersed in the wonderful world of Berrybrook, despite the fact that my children are no longer Berrybrook students. One specific perk for me is that I still get the newsletter, and time and again I am impressed and often deeply touched by Mrs. Keeley's "Notes from the Headmaster". Her article in March certainly qualified on both counts. The words could not ring more true for me and I would assume most of the parents who read it. Two quotes in particular are worth reemphasizing: "although some things today are different than they were during [Mrs. Dunmore's] tenure, the essence of the Berrybrook philosophy and values remain" and "Our teachers possess the same standards of training, experience, commitment and caring set by Katharine Mann and Jinny Dunmore".

As a parent when my children were still Berrybrook students, I was so often aware of the fact that being at Berrybrook felt like stepping back in time, in a way that allowed me to let go of the preoccupations and stresses of modern life and relish the simplest of pleasures. In fact, even now that I am a far less frequent visitor I still feel this in an almost palpable way whenever I open the gate and pass through. This feeling has remained persistent and consistent despite the fact that I had children attend school both in the old farmhouse and the temporary buildings (during construction). At times is seems as though there is a spell cast on this place that makes is so undeniably delightful.

However, being a board member has given me a peak behind the curtain at the actual workings of the school and I am more aware than ever that the magic is directly attributable to the individuals who work here, specifically Mrs. Keeley and all the Berrybrook teachers. Over the past 2 years I have had the great privilege of meeting regularly with the staff and getting an inside view of all the awe inspiring thought, preparation and attention to detail that goes into each activity on any given day. It is not by accident that the atmosphere at Berrybrook is so soothing and conducive to personal growth for both the children and the families that come here.

It is worth mentioning that the staff at Berrybrook have lives outside the school that are comprised of most of the same elements that we all have. That means they share many of the pressures, stresses and burdens that we all face on a daily basis. However, when they walk through the gate they have an uncanny and I would say enviable ability to set all that aside and focus on the monumental task at hand . . . to nurture our children and promote their well being on all levels.

And I have no doubt that their smiles and kind words and gentle demeanor are entirely sincere, despite whatever difficulties they may have faced or may face each day. They have chosen to take on one of the most important and challenging jobs that exists, one that is typically quite messy, both literally and figuratively. One in which no two days are the same and each day they are faced with a room full of individuals still struggling to master control over their bodies, minds and emotions. A job that requires them to have

mastery in so many areas that it is almost impossible to name them all, but here is just a sample: mathematician, musician, magician, pediatrician . . . artist, ornithologist, entomologist, epidemiologist. . . . and it would be remiss of me to not mention child psychologist. And yet they do it willingly, with enthusiasm and passion.

As with any individual who demonstrates mastery in a given area, they make it all look so easy. However, this is only achieved through countless hours honing their skills and great devotion to the tasks at hand. It is important to note that they are not driven by visions of fame, fortune and glory but rather a genuine desire to make a difference in the lives of their students and their families by guiding us all through the critical and challenging years of early education.

Yet, never in all my years at Berrybrook have I witnessed anything even close to resembling chaos, despite the perfect storm of ingredients for it that exist at any given time. I have witnessed on any number of occasions members of the staff tackle very difficult situations, involving children and parents alike, with great composure and empathy for those involved. They treat everyone with the same degree of dignity and respect. Despite all the structure and consistency, there is never a doubt that they highly value individuality and do everything in their power to provide what is needed for each member of the Berrybrook community to flourish.

And flourish we all do. Even though my children have outgrown the tiny chairs in the Berrybrook classrooms, the residual influences are still quite apparent. My family and I are forever changed for the better by the time spent at this magnificent place, in the company of these extraordinary people. So as another year comes to a close, I would like once again to most sincerely thank Mrs. Keeley and all the Berrybrook teachers and assure them all that they continue to achieve the goal of serving the entire Berrybrook community with "love and grace".
