Toys of Value

Making decisions about what toys to purchase during the holidays gets more difficult each year. Children and parents are inundated with television ads from thousands of toy makers trying to convince them that their toy is best.

Parents are under tremendous pressure to buy the "hot" item that may be sold through films, TV ads and even fast food restaurants. Play is essential for children and toys are the tools of play. Healthy toys promote imaginative, creative, interesting, and long lasting play. A group called TRUCE (Teachers for Resisting Unhealthy Children's Entertainment) has some hints for choosing healthy toys. They recommend the following:

- Choose toys that can be used in many ways
- Choose toys that allow the children to determine the play
- Choose toys that appeal to children at more than one age
- Choose toys that are not linked to video games, TV or movies
- Choose toys that can be used with other toys for new and more complex play
- Choose toys that promote respectful, non-stereotyped, nonviolent interactions
- Choose some gifts to make at home with your children to give to others. Berrybrook Playdough is always a nice gift!

Berrybrook School Playdough Recípe

4 cups flour 2 cups salt 4 cups water 4 tbsp oil 4 tbsp cream of tartar

Mix all in a large pot. Cook on medium heat until dough forms. Cool, knead, and store in an air-tight container.



Berrybrook will cancel school if Duxbury Schools <u>or</u> the Silver Lake School District close due to a snow emergency. Please watch the news for cancellation notices. Parents may call the school to check the voice mail message if they are unsure about a snow cancellation. In rare situations, there may be times when we must cancel classes during the day to ensure the safety of our children, families and staff. In those cases, the teachers will phone families in their class.

Remember to send your child dressed appropriately for outdoor play everyday! Berrybook children will go outside unless it is raining or freezing. When in doubt, it is better to pack boots, snow pants, mittens and hat than to be caught without those items!

Enrollment 2010-2011

During the holiday break, the office will be mailing Berrybrook parents reenrollment information for the 2010-2011 school year. The month of January is reserved for current and alumni families to enroll. Applications from new families will be processed starting in February. Our goal is to meet the needs of all of our current families and every effort will be made to accommodate parent preference. However, parents should be aware that Berrybrook reserves the right to make class placement based on the needs of the children and the composition of the group. Helen Wheeler Scholarshíp Fund

The Berrybrook Board of Directors sets aside funds for tuition assistance through the Helen Wheeler Scholarship Fund. The fund was created in honor of Berrybrook's first director and teacher. It truly honors Berrybrook's founder, Katharine Mann and her vision to provide a quality early educational opportunity for all children. To raise these tuition assistance funds, the Board of Directors conducts an Annual Appeal. A letter goes out to current and past families every spring. The Appeal is an opportunity for families to make a contribution to the fund so others may be able to experience Berrybrook. Donations to the Appeal are welcome at any time during the year. After agreeing that recruiting volunteers to sign up for scheduled parking lot duty was impractical, and setting aside certain spots for parents with young ones would mean setting aside the entire parking lot, the solution that was finally proposed was to encourage **"Random Acts of Kindness."**

I am well aware that Berrybrook parents need no encouragement to help each other out. I see many thoughtful acts happening in the classrooms, hallways, playground and parking lot. I am positive Berrybrook parents would not hesitate to help if asked. What we want to encourage is the extra step of offering help to a parent who may be too shy to ask.
