Second Year Program News

We have some wonderful activities planned to ring in the new year. In January we'll begin our discussions of cold and wintry weather. We'll talk about snow, temperatures, wind chill factors and most importantly how to properly dress for this type of weather. The children are encouraged to dress all by themselves including zippers, snaps and buttons. Proper fitting boots, mittens, hats, snowsuits or snow pants are appreciated. Tight fitting clothing can be very frustrating to children learning how to dress themselves. In fact, they may give up trying. It is helpful for the children to practice dressing themselves at home. Thank you for encouraging them to do so.

In mid January we'll begin our unit on health. The children will make a book about themselves and learn about healthy foods and dental health. At the end of the month we'll begin learning about space. We'll cover planets, comets, asteroids and the moon. The children always come up with very interesting questions. We are fortunate t o k n o w s o m e o n e w h o i s knowledgeable about the subject and is happy to help us answer the children's questions.

We'd like to thank parents who have graciously volunteered their time to help

out in our classrooms. If you have a special interest or hobby/collection that you'd like to share please let the teachers know. The children are always excited to have visitors and they benefit greatly from your experiences.

For upcoming projects we will need any greeting cards that you may be discarding. All types of cards are needed (birthday, holiday, get-well, etc.). We're happy and grateful for whatever you can donate.

In February shoeboxes (any size) are needed for our Valentine's Day celebration, and we will also be studying postage stamps. Please save envelopes that have cancelled stamps. The children will be cutting the stamps off for an upcoming activity.

Cold Weather Tips

The first cold weather we had in December reminded us to be prepared. By now parents have located all snow pants, boots, hats and mittens that had been packed away.

At Berrybrook we will go out every day that is not freezing or raining. Children should come prepared for the outdoors. We know that some days it is hard to tell what the weather conditions will be at the end of the session, so when in doubt, you could pack snow pants and boots in a tote bag to have in the cubby.

Please remember to have your child arrive with boots, hat, mittens, jacket and snow pants. Even when there is no snow, these extra clothes allow for warm, comfortable outdoor play. Please mark each item with your child's name.

Snow Cancellation Berrybrook will cancel school if Duxbury Schools <u>or</u> the Silver Lake School District close due to a snow emergency.

Because many Berrybrook families and staff travel from outlying communities, it is our policy to cancel classes whenever Duxbury Public Schools and/or Silver Lake Schools are closed. Parents should watch news reports for cancellation of these school systems. The voice mail system at Berrybrook at 781-585-2307 will have a snow cancellation message if we are closed due to a snow emergency. Beyond a formal cancellation, we urge parents to use their best judgment about driving young children to school in inclement weather. In the event of a severe snow storm, power failure, loss of heat or other emergency, the school may be required to close early. Parents will be contacted to pick up children. Children will remain with Berrybrook staff until released to a parent or emergency contact.

Our goal is to meet the needs of all of our current families and every effort will be made to accommodate parent preference. However, parents should be aware that Berrybrook reserves the right to make class placement based on the needs of the children and the composition of the group.
