


Notes from the Head of School

Minutes after the 'Christmas season' is over, stores seem to shun the red and green color palette and switch to red and pink for Valentine's Day (hey, some stores have this marketing plan even before the after-Christmas sales! While the first weeks of the New Year seem to focus on endearing phrases and expressions of love, at Berrybrook these descriptive and emotional words are encouraged every day of the year. However, we don't only encourage the hearts and rainbows types of words; we support children to use words to express all their emotions. When children seem to struggle to find the 'right' words, teachers help children model the words for them. We do this by asking the children how they feel about a situation, and allow the other side to express their feelings. We help the children to understand how the other side might be feeling to help build upon their empathy. If they really struggle, we might say to them "Well if this was happening to me, I might feel X,Y,Z" or "Let's look at so-and-so's face to see if we know what she may be feeling".

It is a crucial life lesson for children to be able to learn to express themselves all the time, during both positive and not-so-positive interactions. These interactions are the basis for friendships being made in classrooms, and is best to be in a comfortable and secure space to learn how important and powerful their words can be. Words can be used to sting, and words can be used to heal. The "You're not going to be invited to my birthday party!" can really hurt and the "Are you okay; how can I help you?" can really soothe. We get excited when we hear both - we have the opportunity to help children manage so many emotions involved with both of these scenarios! This is Berrybrook's bread and butter, and the reason why we all are SO passionate about our work. Thank you for entrusting us to help your children develop these epiphanies!

Each class plans ahead for the holiday by creating "mailboxes" to collect their valentines. The children in the Beginners class decorate valentine bags to line the hallway outside their classroom door. A valentine pouch is decorated by each 2 and 3 Day student to be attached to the front of their cubby for the holiday. The 4 and 5 Day children recycle a shoebox from home that they paint and decorate with glitter for the special event.

The children, age-appropriately, ready the valentines that will be hand-delivered. There is a lot of hard work involved in preparing these cards, and the children are so proud of their efforts. On the celebration day, the children so carefully and enthusiastically deliver a valentine to each classmate and excitedly let others know that the valentine is waiting for them to open.

Group time themes usually include discussions of love, kindness, caring, and thoughtfulness. "What does it mean to be kind?" "How can you show someone you love them?" "How do others take care of you and show you kindness and love?" The children always have so much input to our discussions and so much to share with one another. It is always heartwarming to know how they are thinking and feeling.

Thank you all for sharing your children with us every day. This month is always a great reminder of why we do what we do. Celebrating Valentine's Day with preschoolers is always a great opportunity for all of us to stop and take a moment to appreciate those we love and care about.
