With temps the last week of May in the mid-forties it doesn't seem possible that here we are on the cusp of our traditional Ice Cream Days! Yet here we are and once again it seems like time is a thief. The students who cried every day those first few days are confidentially striding into their classroom and ready for their next journey. "Senioritis" of the 4 and 5 Day students is in full effect, where they have almost outgrown their Berrybrook selves and are SO ready for kindergarten.

It is not without the contributions of so many that makes Berrybrook. We are in the middle of our NAEYC reaccreditation (by the time this newsletter comes out, our visit should be complete!). Part of the process involves creating program and classroom portfolios which is a huge undertaking. At the beginning of my program portfolio, I include some thoughts to share with the validator which to me tries to explain Berrybrook. In part, my prelude says:

I am so proud of Berrybrook and all it represents. I am humbled each and every time I walk into this school with its seventy year history and traditions. Berrybrook, through my various roles during my over twenty years here, has helped shape me as a professional, a mom, a colleague, a wife, a leader, an aunt, a friend, and more.

The portfolios are a beautiful way to demonstrate that Berrybrook follows and adheres to all state and national regulations, and in fact, goes beyond those requirements. I also

feel compelled to write about what cannot be measured, but I am certain that whoever walk into Berrybrook can feel it.

We often speak of the "Berrybrook Way" which is not simple to describe but yet is so simple. The Berrybrook Way is a state of mind, a way of being. It's a feeling you get when you walk through the front gate. It's knowing that the focus is on the children, and helping shape them into productive members of society. It's a place where we know that we are all teachers, regardless of age, and that we all learn from each other. It's stopping to think of another's perspective as well as our own. All of us who work Berrybrook have had a family member at least once comment that we are 'Berrybrooking them' ... What does that mean you ask? It's a way of rephrasing things from a negative to a positive. "Don't run" becomes "Please walk", "Don't whine" becomes "Please use a speaking voice so I can understand you", "Get off the table" becomes "We sit in chairs at the table". Respect and validation is crucial at Berrybrook, whether we are working with children or adults, and our goal is to be spreading the Berrybrook Way through our families, who can then spread it throughout the world. The impact could be exponential and amazing. There is a venue in town where many families have birthday parties, and the owners of the venue often remark that they know when it's a group of Berrybrook students celebrating because "you can just tell, from the way they speak to each other".

What also cannot be measured is the amount of activity in all our our minds, both in and out of school, and how we can really never turn our minds off. It's the calls and texts before and after school between teachers who think of other ways to reach a child who may be struggling. It's not "checking off a box" in regards to curriculum, because for us each and every lesson plan is a life lesson. It's also the alumni who, on a half day from school, RUN into Berrybrook to see their former teachers and the administration to report all about their "big school" and to also tell how much they wish they could be back at Berrybrook. It's the parents who we run into many years down the road who also tell us now much they wish they could be back at Berrybrook when things were simpler; and to thank us for how much Berrybrook impacted not only their child(ren) but also their family, their friendships, and more. It's the support that families give to other families in the class - Meal Trains to celebrate a new baby, helpful advice to those who have experienced similar situations, support when a family experiences a tragedy.

I wish the reader of this portfolio could read every "Notes from the Head of School" I have written throughout the years for our monthly newsletter. I am proud of them, and feel they exude what and who we are.

In 1954, Mrs. Katharine Mann founded Berrybrook with a dream

"to provide a place to develop self esteem and confidence, to help a child not to be afraid to fail – to learn by trying." She wanted children to have the opportunity to explore and create, to learn from hands on experience, to learn to handle feelings and to accept them, to search out beauty in the world around them, to delight in exercising their bodies and to find out what they can do; a program that gives children time to develop their own ideas and to find their own answers." Not a day goes by where I don't think of her and her impact on not only the thousands of children associated with Berrybrook (my three included), but also what an amazing woman she was. As a pioneer in the early education field, along with being a female small business owner in the 1950s - WOW! What a woman, and I am so very proud to help carry out her vision each and every day.

Thank you for your part in Berrybrook's history this past year. Whether you are moving on to a new chapter or staying with us another year, know that the Berrybrook gates are always open to you and your family.

### **Teacher's Notes** Learning Through Summer Fun

Summer is the perfect time for preschoolers to learn through play! Whether they are building sandcastles, pretending to be animals, or running through the sprinkler; young children are discovering new things every day. Play helps them grow their imaginations, solve problems, and build important social skills without even realizing they are learning!

Summer is full of exciting learning moments. Collecting rocks or leaves turns into a nature scavenger hunt. Splashing in the water teaches cause and effect. Making a pretend lemonade stand builds early math and language skills. The world becomes a classroom when children are given the time and space to explore, wonder, and create. Here are some things we do at Berrybrook that you can do at home to continue learning during the Summer ...

Nature Walk Counting: Count birds, leaves or steps while walking outside.

*Water Play Science* : Use cups, spoons, and sponges in a water bin to explore pouring, floating and sinking.

*Sidewalk Chalk Games*: Draw letters, numbers or shapes and play hopscotch-style games to identify them.

*Cooking Together:* Measure ingredients, count scoops, or talk about colors and textures while making simple snacks.

*Scavenger Hunts*: Make a list of things to find by color, shape or size. This is great for vocabulary and observation skills.

*Sing and Move*: Sing favorite songs, add hand motions and props, or make up dances. Music builds memory and rhythm.

*Story Time Anywhere*: Bring books to the park, beach, or backyard for a relaxing readaloud under the sun. Adding props to a story time is always a plus!

Families can help support this kind of learning by keeping things simple and playful. Reading books under a shady tree, building a blanket fort on a rainy day, or baking together can all spark curiosity. Spending time together, adding a little creativity and some summer fun can make learning joyous and meaningful at home.

Here are some wonderful picture books to enjoy with your child this summer:

\* *And Then Comes Summer* by Tom Brenner..... A joyful celebration of all things summer, from lemonade stands to barefoot days.

\* *A Day at the Seashore* by Kathryn and Byron Jackson..... A sweet, classic Little Golden Book about a day spent exploring the beach.

\* *Jabari Jumps* by Gaia Cornwall..... A beautifully illustrated story about courage and trying new things, perfect for summer pool days.

\* *Ice Cream Summer* by Peter Sis..... A clever and colorful book that mixes learning and ice cream, what could be better?

\* *The Watermelon Seed* by Greg Pizzoli..... Silly and fun, this book is a big hit with preschoolers who love juicy summer snacks.

\* *Llama Llama Sand and Sun* by Anna Dewdney..... A simple, friendly board book that celebrates beach day fun with a familiar character.
